Map of proposed **Historic Five Oaks District**. Properties inside blue line would be locally recognized historical district.

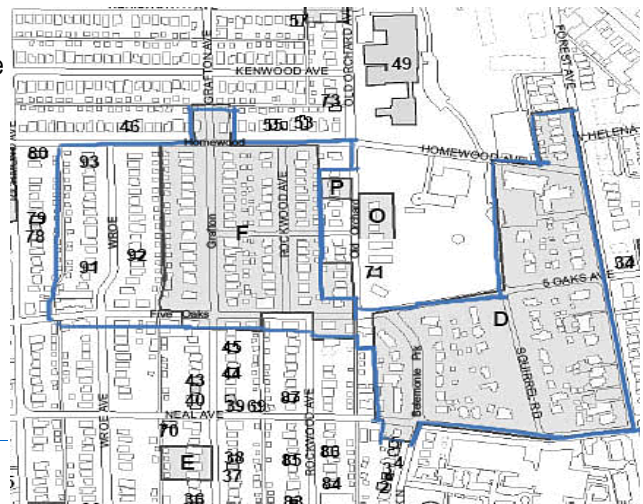
F - Grafton Rockwood National Register District
